THE BOOK OF GALATIANS

Galatians 2:11-21 July 30th 2023

INTRODUCTION

HYP'OCRITE, noun

- **1.** One who feigns to be what he is not; one who has the form of godliness without the power, or who assumes an appearance of piety and virtue, when he is destitute of true religion.
- -There is a hypocrisy that is held in place due to **pride**, but another that is held in place due to **pain**.
- "It is not the being seen of men that is wrong, but doing these things for the purpose of being seen of men. The problem with the hypocrite is his motivation. He <u>does not want to be holy</u>; he **only** wants to seem to be holy. He is more concerned with his <u>reputation for righteousness</u> than about actually becoming righteous. The <u>approbation of men</u> matters more to him than the **approval of** God."—Augustine
- -In a Christian context, hypocrisy will always be an offense to God, because the person in hypocrisy shifts from trying to please God to attempting to please man.

HYPOCRISY VS GOSPEL Galatians 2:11-14

- -The problem of Peter's hypocrisy is not only did it damage his character, it damaged the Gospel.
- -Not many Christians enter churches or gather together understanding the <u>impact of their walk</u> on their **testimony**.
- -How do we live when no one is looking? God is not looking for your reputation. God wants your heart!
- -In the Christian life, the goal is not to be **popular**, but to be **faithful**.
- -The Gospel was defended at the Jerusalem council in **principle**, but Paul is now defending the Gospel in **practice**.
- -In the **Strong's Greek #5272**, the word <u>hypocrisy</u> has a synonym word: *insincerity*.
- -We have allowed *insincerity* to be a <u>common attribute</u> within the church so much that it is a common thing for people to substitute **attendance** for **sincerity**.
- -We are never more like a hypocrite when we settle for an insincere walk with Jesus.
- -In the Greek <u>insincerity is hypocrisy</u> and if we don't address insincerity in our Christian walk, <u>a day</u> will come when we *face the God of the universe* as **hypocrites** rather than **surrendered**.
- -Hypocrites never surrender to God because they are serving someone else, usually themselves, but a person surrendered to God will surrender to no other.
- -The genuine believer understands their inconsistencies before God and lives a lifestyle of surrender to see <u>God's work</u> in their heart.

JUSTIFIED BY FAITH Galatians 2:15-21

- -When someone <u>falls into sin</u>, or they <u>slip in their walk</u>, what often happens first is they quit praying, studying the Word, and ultimately, they withdraw from the gathering. It is a "<u>justified by</u> works" mentality.
- -"Justified by faith" is the most difficult thing for a believer to accept, because <u>we often judge our own performance</u>, our own **efforts**, or lack thereof. We **look to ourselves** rather than **looking to the cross**.
- -In the middle of verse 16 we see the statement that we have "believed in Christ Jesus." Literally in the Greek it means we have "believed **into** Christ Jesus." This is an <u>act of commitment to Christ</u>, not just understanding what He has done, but running to Him for **refuge** and **mercy**.
- -For the Christian, every act of service is an act of **surrender**, an act of **faith**. Rather than setting ourselves on display in what we do, we now <u>set Christ on display</u>. It is the same reason why the Gospel deters us from sin because our sins **malign the glory of Christ**.
- -Christ didn't die on the cross for your sins in order that you would continue in them. The cross has always meant **not only to save you**, but to **produce something in you**.

<u>Galatians 2:20</u> (ESV) I have been crucified with Christ. <u>It is no longer I who live</u>, but **Christ who lives** in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the <u>Son of God</u>, who loved me and gave himself for me.

- -The <u>incredible position</u> that the Gospel sets <u>in view of the believer</u> is this realization that **God's love conquers all**.
- **-The Law** communicates to those keeping it to <u>try harder</u>. **The Gospel** calls us **in surrender** to <u>draw</u> closer.
- -For the believer, it's <u>not that we cannot sin</u>, we can and we have, but <u>we do not want to</u> because it is **not who we are now**.
- -Have you surrendered in such a way that Christ reigns in your entire life?

More than God is asking you to live the Christian life, you surrender so that **Christ lives in you**.
